

ORDINANCE NO. 1430

AN ORDINANCE ENTITLED "AN ORDINANCE AMENDING OR ADDING SECTIONS 5-40, 5-42 AND 5-44 RELATED TO THE IMPOUNDMENT OF ANIMALS BY AMENDING THE FEES CHARGED FOR IMPOUNDMENT AND REQUIRING ANIMALS TO HAVE PREREQUISITE INNOCULATIONS OR BE SUBJECT TO FINE AND COSTS."

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISON, SOUTH DAKOTA, TO WIT:

That Sections 5-40, 5-42 and 5-44 of the Revised Ordinances of the City of Madison, also known as the Code of Ordinances be amended or added to read as follows:

Section 5-40. Fees.

The following fees shall be charged for the impoundment of any animal:

- (1) For the first redemption of the animal within the calendar year, twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars.
- (2) For the second redemption of the animal within the calendar year, thirty-five (\$35.00) Dollars.
- (3) For each additional redemption of the animal within the calendar year, forty-five (\$45.00) Dollars.

An additional fee of ten (\$10.00) Dollars shall be charged for each day, or fraction thereof, of impoundment for feeding and caring for any animal.

Section 5-42. Redemption by person other than owner with city approval.

If the owner of any animal impounded under the provisions of this chapter shall fail to redeem his animal within three (3) days after such impoundment, another person may, upon complying with the provisions of this chapter, redeem such animal from the pound with City approval and be the lawful owner of such animal thereafter.

Section 5-44. Inoculations Required.

- A. The owner or any party removing an animal from impound shall, within 96 hours of its release, provide to the City documentation that all shots, inoculations or immunizations of the animal are up-to-date or current.

- B. The penalty for any person convicted of any such violation shall be punishable by fine, imprisonment or both as specified in Section 1-8 General Penalty; continuing violations.
